Daily **I WILL** exemplify a heart for the lost.

- Learn to view sinners as lost, not bad.
- Compassion moves us to take action.
- We reach out in order to bring people in.

Remember what it felt like to finally discover that there was hope in Jesus Christ for you? Remember the joy you felt when you first met Jesus Christ and knew that somehow everything was going to be okay? Well, there are multitudes of people that still do not know of this hope that we have. It can be easy to forget what it felt like to sit in darkness, especially after finding new life in Jesus Christ, the Light of the world. You don't have to wait until you are a bible scholar or until you hold a ministry title to begin to reach out to people who are lost without hope.

When Jesus saw sinful people, He didn't call them "bad." He called them "lost." He was moved by compassion for them and it compelled Him to move toward them. Supporting Statements:

- The only thing going to heaven are people. Make sure you take as many with you as you can.
- Make it your mission to unload hell and fill up heaven.
