Praise and Worship

This course teaches the corporate and individual aspects of praise and worship. Students will learn both spiritual and practical elements of what is involved during praise and worship in a church environment.

What is Praise?

- 1. Praise is a unifying factor.
- 2. Praise is **power**.
- 3. **Praise is a discipline** that requires our initiative regardless of our emotions.
- 4. Praise is **not contingent upon our feelings** it is based upon God's greatness.
- 5. Praise is something we direct **toward God** or something we **express to others** about God.

What is Praise?

- Another word for praise is Judah
- Praise must function according to our will and not our emotions.
- Praise can be used as a weapon.
- Praise can be given as a sacrifice.
 - 3 ways in which praise is costly.
 - Time
 - Energy
 - Preparation
- Praise is a **garment.**

Why Do We Praise?

- Because He Is:
 - Worthy of thanks
 - Worthy of praise
 - Great
 - Mighty in acts
- Because He:
 - Chose us
 - Commands us to praise
- Psalm 103:3-6

What is Worship?

- A set of religious forms by which this reverence is expressed
- Reverence for a deity or sacred object

What is Worship?

- Worship is a conversation between God and Man, a dialogue that should go on constantly in the life of a Christian.
- Worship is one's heart expression of love, adoration, and praise to God with an attitude and acknowledgement of His supremacy and Lordship.
- Worship is the ability to magnify God with our whole being-body, soul, and spirit.
- Worship starts in the **heart.**

What's the Difference?

Praise – gratitude for what He **has done**Worship – acknowledging **Who He is**

Old Testament type and shadow of outer court vs. inner court

PRAISE and WORSHIP are two separate entities, but they are often impossible to **separate**.

Praise can sometimes be **distant**, but worship is usually **intimate**.

Praise is largely **horizontal** in its purpose, while worship is primarily a **vertical** interaction.
