- Introduce the adventures of being a bold, Bible believer

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

CONNECTION VS. RELATIONSHIP









Connection is a basic human need which establishes a sense of belonging. No person is an island, and we need healthy relationships to thrive. Psychologists use the word "connection" to explain the experience of oneness. It's having shared experiences, relatable feelings, or similar ideas. This is true of introverts and extroverts. That is God's plan!

We all have an inherent desire to connect on multiple levels; spiritually, emotionally, socially and physically is God's plan for your wholeness. These scriptures reinforce this concept:

My intercessor is my friend as my eyes pour out tears to God...as one pleads for a friend. Job 16:20

A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity. Prv. 17:17

You have many relationships that do not offer connection; colleagues, a friendly waitress, or a cousin without common values. But once a connection occurs, a relationship begins.


If you wonder why this gets muddy so quickly, consider how many types of relationships there are.

11 TYPES OF RELATIONSHIPS

- **Short-term** positive or negative, but lasting less than 6 months
- **Long-term** lasting 5 years or longer due to family ties, geography, or employment
- Stagnant a relationship that guit growing and now exists out of routine or duty
- **Vibrant** committed to personal growth and/or joint pleasure goals
- **One-sided** only one person is interested in developing the relationship
- **Co-dependent** an unhealthy dependence on a person
- Platonic involving friendship, affection, or love without sexual relations between people who
 might be expected to be sexually attracted to each other
- **Romantic** involving sensual desires beyond a platonic friendship
- **Unequally yoked** two people with different commitment levels to Chris

HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

God wants you healed, whole, and happy, but wholeness is misunderstood. Consider the man successful in business, yet his marriage is in disarray. Is he whole? I think not. Across the street from that business tycoon lives a lonely widow whose joys are collected in photos from her past. Is she whole? Not since her husband died. If wholeness isn't found in financial success or familial I ve, where is it hidden?

WHOLENESS COMES FROM HOLINESS

Holiness is not equivalent to a monk in a cave. To be holy means to be "set apart" for God or a sacred purpose. It's an attitude of, "I belong to God. Everything I am, everything I have and everything I do is to bring Him glory." Your personal wholeness is determined by the degree you accept that truth. You are only as whole as you are holy. Consider the school teacher who regards her classroom as an opportunity to shine God's love. Her secular occupation has now become holy; dedicated to God.

Wholeness occurs when our first and foremost relationship is with God. Jesus reveals wholeness in six words: Love God. Love People. Love Yourself.

'And you shall love the Lord your God with all your ______, with all your ______, with all your ______, with all your ______, and with all your ______.' This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. Mk 12:30-31

FOUR RELATIONAL LEVELS

The mantra "less is more" applies to relationships. Let's face it. You just can't be connected to everyone. Healthy relationships require commitment, so your first step is to resist the pressure to be best friends with everyone. Evaluate and categorize your relationships in four levels:

01 Casual

This person is identifiable by name or appearance (100 ppl. or more) Your only obligation is to represent Jesus Christ well. This includes your social media followers.

02. Close

This person is important to you (25 ppl. or more) Your obligation is to influence them positively through your Christian lifestyle.

03. Committed

This is a relationship that you are developing whether its results are positive or negative (approx. 15ppl.). It often includes relatives or long-term friends with different values, so unconditional love is the foundation.

04. Covenent

Long term friends who are divinely connected to pursue His purposes (approx. 5 ppl.)



BIBLE EXAMPLES

Since your friends determine your destiny, being intentional about your Christian relationships becomes paramount. Consider the attributes of these special friends in the Bible:

Commitment - Ruth was committed to Naomi, her mother-in-law, and became happily married to a wealthy man. *Ru.1:16*

Courage - It was Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah's covenant with God and friendship to each other as teenagers which decades later provided the courage needed to break rank from pagan worship and dance with the Son of God in a fiery furnace. *Dan. 3:1-30 (Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego)*

Perseverance - Four men lowered their paralyzed friend through a roof so Jesus could heal him. Mk. 2:5

Loyalty - Luke remained loyal even when Paul was put in prison and considered a heretic.

Teamwork - Paul includes a list of 31 friends in Romans chapter 16 who helped him preach the gospel.

As a result of sin, it only takes three chapters into the Bible to find serious problems among the relationships of humanity's first family. Some of them might be in your family, too.



Negative relationships are destructive to your life in a variety of ways. Perhaps you have experienced toxic relationships for so long that you no longer realize how negatively influenced you a e by them. Be aware.

You can choose to walk away from a toxic relationship today.

ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIPS

Abuse in relationships is cyclical.



Physical Abuse

- Hitting, grabbing, pushing
- Intimidation (blocking doors, hitting things or throwing objects at or near a friend)
- Using or threatening to use weapons
- On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. *The National Coalition Against Domestic Violence*

Sexual Abuse

- Rape forced penetration without consent. (includes statutory rape, rape by intoxication, date rape)
- Making someone feel too scared to say "yes" or "no" regarding any sexual activity
- Unsafe sex
- 1 in 5 women and 1 in 71 men in the United States has been raped in their lifetime. *The National Coalition Against Domestic Violence*

Emotional/Mental/Verbal Abuse

- Using put-downs, insults, name-calling or backhanded compliments
- Threats to kill you, kill myself, kill family or friends, kill children, pets, new boyfriend/girlfriend, kidnapping
- Threats like, "If you leave me, I will...tell your parents we had sex, spread rumors, give you no money, take the children."
- Blaming the person who is being abused for abuse; making them feel guilty
- Minimizing or denying one's abusive behavior
- One person isolating the other from friends or family
 - Possessiveness (questioning someone's whereabouts, activities, etc.)
 - Almost half of all women and men in the US have experienced psychological aggression by an intimate partner in their lifetime. *National Domestic Violence Hotline*

Financial Abuse

- · Controlling all money or using it to get what they want
- Controlling possessions; car, cell phone, clothes, jewelry, gifts
 - Excessive gift giving, especially to make up for abusive behavior
 - Financial abuse occurs in 99% of domestic violence cases. Center for Financial Security

BREAKING THE CYCLE

Abusive people usually experienced some type of abuse themselves. The expression "Monkey-See-Monkey-Do" applies here. When your dad's anger erupted, your mom got slapped. It hurt you to watch, yet you learned to connect that behavior with anger. In years to come, you find yourself doing the same thing. Monkey-see-monkey-do.

You can break the cycle of learned behavior by exposing the ______ and creating personal______.

Whether your red flag is just demanding or dange ous, the steps to freedom are the same.

This is not normal.

This is not healthy.

This is not ok.

This will not be my story.

There's a reason your windshield is larger than your rearview mirror. Move forward.

CREATING YOUR NEW LIFE

Kudos! You have made a courageous decision to disengage and walk away from that toxic relationship. Now what? Self-help books offer strong exit strategies from unhealthy relationships. But, wait! There's more!

You have God's operating in you
I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. Ph. 4:13
1. Can you admit their behavior is destructive for you? How?
2. Describe one week of freedom from that person.
3. How can you depend more on God's unlimited power, not just your willpower?
4. What can you do practically to proactively prepare? (Delete photos, avoid locations that trigger memories, etc.)
5. Break toxic patterns with God's promises. Write out Ps. 27:1.
6. Who is your support team that knows of your decision to move on?
7. What one person will you be accountable to for thirty days?
8. Replace that destructive habit with a positive one. What will it be? (Replace complaining with intentional gratitude.)

This is a **spiritual journey.** You are replacing destructive strongholds with God's promises. This is a **physiological journey.** You are replacing old brain patterns with new brain connections. This is a **social journey.** You are replacing negative relationships with a positive support team.

ANGER MANAGEMENT

TEN FACTS ABOUT ANGER

- 1. Anger is a God-given emotion, which can be either positive or negative.
- 2. Anger occurs when we are inconvenienced, threatened, demeaned, or hindered from a goal.
- 3. Anger occurs when personal rights are not yielded to God.
- 4. Anger occurs when hurt and disappointment aren't given to the Lord.
- 5. Anger is not a sin if you deal with it appropriately.
- 6. Anger cannot be ignored, or it will progress to destructive expressions.
- 7. Unresolved anger will lead to unforgiveness and bitterness.
- 8. Sinful anger is always destructive:
 - a. Destroys a person's emotional and/or physical health
 - b. Destroys property
 - c. Destroys positive purpose or cause
- 9. Anger is the opposite of meekness.
- 10. Anger is not a demon. It is a fruit of the flesh. Gal. 5:2

SEVEN TYPES OF ANGER

Anger manifests in various ways. Its progression can be clearly seen in Paul's six descriptive words in Ephesians 4:31 and serves as an urgent instruction to deal with anger appropriately. The solution can be found in the very next verse.

Problem:

Solution:

EPHESIANS 4:31 NIV

Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice.

EPHESIANS 4:32 NIV

Bitterness (Gr. pikros) - buried anger

Bitterness occurs when disappointment is not handled God's way. Do you dwell on

- what people did to you that was mean, hurtful, or thoughtless?
- what people did not do for you that we feel they should have done?

Learn to give that grievance to God quickly and forgive that person's obligation to meet your needs. If not, a slow progression from offense to resentment to bitterness will take root in your heart, and you'll live in a silent prison of hate.

O2. Sudden Anger
Rage (Gr. thumos) - explosive anger

Bitterness turns into a boiling rage that bubbles up inside of you. This type of anger vents on social media, kicks the cat, hits the wall, or worse.

Brawling includes contentious, arguments, and "fighting mad" physical fights. It disregards all consequences and quickly destroys the supportive tone needed to build strong relationships.



06. Stubborn Anger Stubborn (Heb. sarar) - A refusal to repent or forgive

Stubborn anger is a sin because there is a refusal to repent of sin, forgive others or renounce your desire for revenge.

And "don't sin by letting anger control you." Don't let the sun go down while you are still angry, for anger gives a foothold to the devil. Eph. 4:26-27 NLT

WHY TO FORGIVE

When you have experienced injustice and emotional pain, it seems reasonable to ask, "Why do I need to forgive them?" Here are some reasons to consider:

The Louis Zamperini Story







Louis Zamperini was a US prisoner of war in World War II. He survived forty-seven days in a lifeboat in the shark infested Pacific waters after his B-24 bomber crashed. Captured by the Japanese, he endured tormenting treatment which, upon his release, caused years of alcoholism and post traumatic stress. After Louie met Jesus Christ at a Billy Graham crusade, he returned to Japan to forgive his former war camp guards and was released forever of the hate which imprisoned him. Dying at 97, his life story of courage, resilience, and the power of forgiveness is chronicled in a book and movie, both appropriately titled Unbroken.

Does your family have inconsiderate relatives who hold grudges? Family conflict is inevitable. Secular psychologists recommend managing expectations, setting boundaries, and getting to the root of the issue. While those techniques are beneficial, the Biblical pathway to resolve family conflict is to become a peacemaker.

Peacemakers don't lack backbone or avoid confrontation. They have observed the evils of strife and offense and chosen a higher life. A peace-filled life. A miracle life.

PEACEMAKERS ESCAPE TRAPS

There are several traps that every peacemaker should be warned of, but let's study two which are predominant.

Offense

There are 73 scriptures that make reference to the negative consequences of being offended. Jesus Himself said, "For offenses will come, but woe to that man by whom the offense will come!" Mt. 18:7

What does lesus know that we need to learn about offenses?

- **Offense Can Compound:** Offense p ogresses from an annoyance to resentment to bitterness to a severed relationship.
- **Offense Is a Trap:** The Greek noun for "offense", skandalon, describes the trigger of a trap on which bait is placed to catch an animal. If you react to that jabbing insult, that trap will spring shut, and you'll be caught.
- Offense Taints Your Christian Witness: The future tense verb form, skandalizo, are the roots of our English words "scandal" and "scandalize." In the moral context, picking up an offense indicates the enticement to conduct which will diminish your Christian influence through strife, gossip, etc.







MANAGING YOUR EMOTIONS

Emotions are God's plan, and they serve a valuable purpose. They can connect us to others and point us to God. Emotions can be either positive or negative. What are they? Emotions are subjective reactions to a thought or experience. Because they are unpredictable, they should never be the driving force behind your decisions or actions. As in a steam locomotive, feelings should function as the caboose, not the engine.

They can be your greatest ally or worst enemy. Why?

- Feelings lie.
- Feelings change.
- Your feelings are not final!

DANGER ZONES

Learning to manage your emotions is an important life skill. Damaged emotions are like that cracked windshield. You can get so accustomed to feeling a certain way, it becomes the norm. It's difficult to know what's normal, but these four concepts should be avoided:



- 1. Emotions which are **denied**.
- 2. Emotions which are **suppressed**.
- 3. Emotions which are expressed at **the wrong time**.
- 4. Emotions which are expressed to **the wrong person(s)**.

LETTING GO OF UNHEALTHY ROMANTIC RELATIONSHIPS

- · Admit what happens when you spend time together.
- Admit what type of influence that person has on you
- They are not 'bad' people; just going a different direction.
- Even if lonely at first, there IS life without her/him.
- Begin with a 30 day separation; easier than a total break-up.
- Remove photos and quit contacting him/her.
- Ask God to fill the void with His peace, a new hobby, and new friends.

...One thing I do, forgetting those things behind me and reaching forward to the things that are ahead... Ph. 3:13

Your single season is the perfect time to develop your relationship with the Lord. Read Paul's opinion in I Corinthians 7:34 about the benefit of "being completely devoted to the Lord." Getting focused on your spiritual priorities will become a strong foundation for your future.

HEALTHY GUY/GIRL RELATIONSHIPS

God has beautiful, wholesome, fun friendships waiting for you at TBI and your local church. Don't be robbed of them due to the selfish concept of what's-in-it-for-me dating.

Here are some guidelines to keep your friendship pure:

- Consider them as a sister/brother in the Lord.
- Don't expect or depend on them to fulfill you.
- Guard unlimited talking time which breeds familiarity.
- Don't get jealous when others are with her/him.
- Don't misinterpret kindness as a sign from the Lord for romance.
- Is your motive for being together unselfish?
- Desire to help them, do favors, etc.
- Prove that some guys/girls can be trusted.

Someday, you might meet the spouse of your "special friend." Will they say:

- A. Thanks. You kept her strong until we could meet.
- B. Why did you steal my wife's dignity to feed your selfish flesh?

Do you make-out with your younger sister? So, why would you do that to a sister in Christ?

BOUNDARIES EMPOWER US

One important way to manage your emotions is by creating and writing down personal boundaries. This is not a quick list, but a predetermined set of relational guidelines which are prayerfully created. To remain true to yourself, these are your behavioral red lines which you refuse to cross. They will be tested to the max, yet bring peace and stability to your life.

SIX BENEFITS OF HEALTHY BOUNDARIES

- Boundaries define expectations and show respect for others.
- Boundaries help you identify toxic relationships.
- Boundaries guard your self esteem.
- Boundaries help to limit our selfish inclination to control or manipulate others.
- Boundaries protect us from those who have no self-control.
- Boundaries require us to take responsibility for our own words and behavior.

A WORD ON SOLO SEX

Sex was God's idea. He created you as a sexual being so you could learn the joys of sacrificial love, emotional support and physical intimacy. Within the boundaries of marriage, sex is wonderful, but outside of the boundaries of marriage, sex can lead to emptiness and shame. You'll never regret building an unshakable foundation by putting God first and making your future marriage a priority.

Solo sex, otherwise known as masturbation or self-induced orgasms, is not God's answer to stress or singleness. Learning techniques that bring you temporary pleasure is not God's design. It is self-centered and develops an independence that is not beneficial to your marriage. Read Romans 1:22-32 to understand the deception of perversions and ask the Holy Spirit how to best manage that energy until marriage.

SO, YOU THINK YOU'RE AN ADULT?

Our attention turns now to our young adults who want to be treated as an adult. Are you sure? Adults take care of themselves and think of others.

- **Q.** Why should you pay for gas?
- **A.** Because you're borrowing your dad's car.
- **Q.** Why should you clean the kitchen?
- **A.** Because your mom's exhausted.

Maturity = Manage your Moods!

YOUR EVER-CHANGING RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR PARENTS

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."

A TIME TO OBEY A TIME TO HONOR A TIME TO CARE

While you are a child and under the care (physical, financial, spiritual, emotional) of parents, Ephesians 6:1 instructs you to 'obey' your parents. This is regardless if your parents are Christians or not. God is using them to 'cover' or care for you. Making a quality decision to obey God's Word on this matter will put you in a position for a blessed life, either because of or inspite of your parent's decisions.

The Honor Phase begins after you have accepted all adult responsibilities and are no longer scripturally obligated to obey them. I'm not referring to an unteachable spirit or rebellious attitude. True honor says, "Dad and Mom, I respect your input, but I really believe I've chosen what is right for me." To reject their counsel is not a rejection of their valuable place in your life. God will help you convey that tenderly.

As your parents age, your relationship will go through one last transition. Often, your parents will need emotional care long before physical care. The emotional needs of aging parents can include loneliness or worries about their future. Will they need financial assistance someday? Purpose in your heart today that you will take care of them in their sunset years to the best of your ability. Your parents can become your dearest friends.

Here's a good prayer:

Lord, let me see my parents through Your eyes. Use me to bring them joy and fulfillment.

God will reward every gesture of love and responsibility you demonstrate towards your parents. If they are not appreciative, try to realize how discouraging physical limitations or emotional regrets must be. God can use you to bring them great comfort.







MARRIAGE MATTERS

Many marriages are suffering today due to a secular mindset of What's-in-this-for-me?" and the disastrous pre-conceived myth of romantic love. Here are some descriptions of different types of marriages from my first book, *Miracle Moments*:

WHAT MARRIAGE IS NOT:

- The Let's Make A Deal marriage: You thought you found the ideal. Then you learned you got a raw deal, so now you want a new deal.
- The *Flintstone* marriage: Trying to arrive in your own power.
- The Consumer-oriented marriage: As long as my spouse meets my needs, I stay. If the costs go up or the rewards go down, I bolt, just as I will if a better alternative comes along.
- Blind marriage: When love at first sight is not enough to hold you over to love at last sight.
- Secular mind-set: They date to marry. I do. I did. I'm done.
- Christian mind-set: They marry to date. I do. I did. It's fun.

WHAT MARRIAGE IS

Marriage is a covenant between two imperfect people who refuse to give up on each other. Its foundation is Biblical love, not romantic love. What's the difference? Romantic love is a walk on the beach at sunset, but Biblical love is a commitment to sacrificial love for the good of your spouse. God wired men and women differently with distinctive needs to be supported.

UNDERSTANDING GOD'S DIVINE ORDER

God's plan for marriage is described in Ephesians 5:21-25 as one man and one woman yield to God's love and leadership. It explains God's divine order, and it will always bring peace and joy into your home. People who interpret this as a pecking order need better understanding.

Submitting to one another in the fear of God. Eph. 5:21



WHEN YOU RUN OUT OF LOVE

Learn this quickly, dear ones. Human love is limited and conditional. God's love is unlimited and unconditional. It's common for couples to focus on the annoying differences that develop and decide they don't love each other anymore. "I've run out of love," they say. When you run out of human love, you'll need to tap into God's love. The Greek language separates our English word for 'love' into four different expressions.

Agape	love; God's unconditional, unlimited love
Phileo	love; compatibility, sharing things in common
Storge	love: affection, usually between parents and children
Eros	love; the English word 'erotic' comes from 'eros'

THE "S" WORD

For the husband, the "S" word is sex. Have you wondered why God created men and women with such mismatched sex drives? My personal opinion is because no other relationship requires more sacrificial love. This unselfish love creates a lasting bond. Husbands must choose to put the needs of their wives needs before their own by not demanding sexual moments when she is obviously exhausted. At the same time, wives need to prioritize meeting her husband's physical needs. Read some credible books on sexuality and learn how to satisfy each other.

Husbands, go all out in your love for your wives, exactly as Christ did for the church - a love marked by giving, not getting. Eph. 5:25 Msg.

For the wife, the "S" word is submission, which is a concept vastly misunderstood. Relax, girls. It has nothing to do with being an inferior status or the man's doormat. Elizabeth Elliott, one my favorite authors, defined submission as "the recognition and respect of God-given authority."



Biblical submission isn't yielding to your husband's will, but rather to the Lord's way of doing things. It's embracing the divine order Christ established and trusting Him to lead through and/or deal with your husband. My friend said, "Submission is learning to duck so God hits the husband."

The Greek word for submission, hupotasso, does not mean to obey. It's literal meaning is "to get under and lift up, or to put in order." It can also be a military term referring to the equal sharing of tasks, to support, to fulfill one's part of the assignment.

YIELDING PREVENTS COLLISIONS

Submission can be explained by the metaphor of two Mercedes driving east at 70 mph. One is on the feeder road, while the other is exiting off the interstate. A collision would be guaranteed except for a yellow yield sign. The Mercedes on the feeder honors the yellow yield sign subconsciously, without any resentment. No road rage occurred with Mrs. "Feeder-Road" Mercedes screaming, "You can't control me. Who do you think you are?" They both reached their destination, and life was good.

A COVENANT WITH YOUR EYES

I will set nothing wicked before my eyes... Ps. 101:3

- 64% of Christian men and 15% of Christian women say they watch porn at least once a month.
- The first exposure to pornography among men is 12 years old, on average.
- 56% of divorce cases involve one party having "an obsessive interest in pornographic websites."
- All statistics from CovenantEyes.com.

Pornography is an addiction that ruins marriages and makes men a slave. Jesus Christ can set you free from the addictive grip of porn. Beginning steps include admitting that it is an addiction (not just a bad habit), making a covenant with your eyes, locating an accountability partner, and depending on the Holy Spirit to lead you. There are also informative, hope-filled resources available. Get serious about this sexual sin. It is not okay.

10 TIPS TO GUARD YOUR MARRIAGE


Here are some intentional ideas that will protect your marriage while at work.

- 03. Emotional adultery is real. Limit conversations with the opposite sex to facts, not feelings.
- $\bigcirc 4$ Refuse to listen to or laugh at sensual comments.
- Ladies, even though male compliments boost your ego, wear modest clothing (Advice to our TBI daughters is "If it's not on the menu, don't show it!").
- 06. No secret bonuses or "friends with benefits" are worth your Christian witness.
- O7. If you have a reason to text a man that is not your husband, include your husband or the other man's wife in that text message (This applies to youth leaders, too).
- O8. Do not ride anywhere alone, go out to eat alone, or spend time alone with a man that is not your husband or family member.
- Men, make a vow to God and your wife never to meet with a woman or teenage girl alone; especially in the name of counseling.
- 1 O Some couples combine their Facebook accounts so nothing is ever questioned.

THE A-B-Cs FOR FAITH-FOCUSED FAMILIES

By Rachel Burchfield

Affection - Humans we e designed to express emotional support through physical touch. Appropriate affection includes sitting together, holding hands, tickling, back rubs, hugs, and holding each other when happy, sad or scared.

Bible Reading - Daily Bible reading provides guidance and introduces us to our Father. Let your family see you look to God's Word as your final authority. Invite children to read short portions at family meals or special moments.

Celebrations & Compliments - Celebrate genuine accomplishments on every level, whether a toddler who mastered the swing set or a grandparent who just retired. Encourage one genuine compliment each day.

Discipline - Self-control is a fruit of the Spirit and greatly needed with the family unit. If you don't master your mouth or emotions, they will master you. Discipline is needed regarding finances and screen time, too.

Exciting events - Always have something on the calendar that your family can look forward to. That focus and prepping will breed unity and keep any negative moments of the day in perspective. A beach day, picnic or camping trip is free!

Forgiveness - Learning and modeling Christian forgiveness is the single most important action to embrace for family relationships. Figure it out and practice it daily. "Forgive quickly" is good marriage advice.

Grace-Based Relationships - Not an invisible checklist of impossible standards, but a realization that God loves them in whatever condition they have chosen, and so must we. Samples: "You don't need to earn my love." "I love you at all cost." "God will equip me with everything I need to represent Him appropriately towards you."

Hugs - Scientific studies reveal that hugs can prevent (or benefit) anxiety, depression, sickness and loneliness. They release a message of safety and self-worth. Hug the elderly and the fatherless frequently.

Inspiration - Find ways to inspire your family to reach their goals and personal dreams. Send them a text or tangible item to let them know that you believe in them and "all things are possible."

Jesus - Many relatives don't serve Him because He's been so misrepresented to be a Cosmic Cop. May your life of obedience reveal to your family the true adventure of knowing Him.

Kindness - "Overcome evil with good" (Rom. 12:31) is a family rule which will help sibling rivalry every time. Celebrate all levels of kindness from sharing a toy to washing Dad's car. Catch 'em being good.

Love Letters - Any written expression of love is a tangible treasure. Hide a post-it that they will find later. Dads, buy a card and learn to be verbally affectionate. Grandparents can write an "After I'm gone, please remember..."

Marriage first - The greatest thing parents can do for their children is to love their spouse first. Let them watch you prefer one another and handle disagreements with maturity. A vibrant marriage is a marathon, not a sprint.

No Sarcasm! - Most jesting begins innocently, but becomes a habit of demeaning people. Families should have zero tolerance for family jokes even when discussing relatives who are not there.

Open discussions - Create ground rules for discussing volatile or sensitive topics such as 1) Postpone chat until tempers cease 2) What's the objective? 3) What does the Word say? 4) Try to work together & compromise.

Prayer time - Families who pray together stay together. Start with a weekly one-sentence prayer in a circle. For relatives not yet born again, commit to Spirit-led times of intercession and expect household salvation. Acts 16:31

Quiet times - Families will benefit f om intentionally unplugging together. Fishing from a dock, card games, making cookies or rebuilding an engine. Anything works as long as there is positive, emotional interaction.

Respond, instead of react - When you don't, apologize. A gentle answer turns away wrath. Prov. 15:1

Structure & Schedules - Realistic, age-appropriate boundaries will provide security and prevent strife. Parents cannot be the buddy here. Determine the family dinner nights, screen time, curfew and # of activities allowed and stick to it.

Traditions - What will your family remember in 20 years? Need ideas? Plant a tree for newborns, family communion on New Year's Day, make a family flag or have a movie night. Family traditions provide a familial identity and sense of belonging.

Unconditional love - Human love is limited and has hidden requirements for acceptance, but God's unconditional love believes the best and accepts people as they are. This is not to be confused with a parental need for guidance.

Vocational training - Accomplishments on every level breed confidence and prepare us for our futures. Take time to teach children life skills, social training, and financial accountability.

Work Ethic - Working hard out of responsibility (not feelings) produces positive and productive people. By the age of 8, a child should contribute to the household with some simple chores and suffer consequences if not completed.

Xmas Story - Remember that Jesus is the Reason for the Season. Let that miracle story and those glorious gospel-exalting carols propel you into miracles for your own family.

Yearly Review - Buy a leather bound "Family Journal" and document the year's greatest miracles and goals fulfilled. Write down new goals and prayer requests, too. A nice restaurant is a lovely location for this special event.

Zeal for God's House - Families who attend church regularly are more likely to be emotionally anchored, socially strong and prepared for a successful future. A parent's top priority question: "Am I raising this child to know and love the Lord?"
