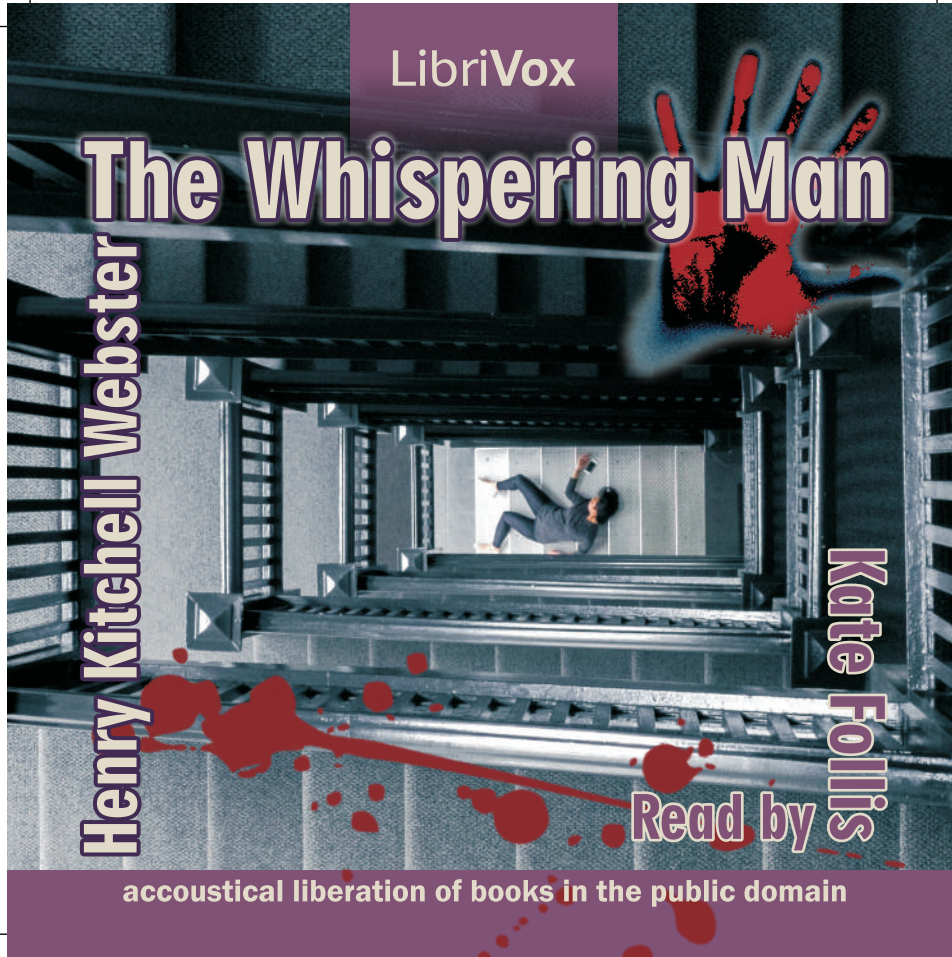

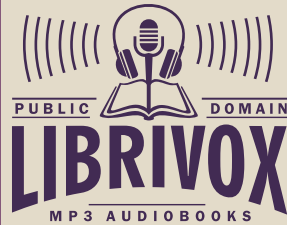

Samuel Merwin, with whom he later collaborated to write one of his more famous works, *Calumet "K"* (1901) - *from Wikipedia*

FOLD A to A & B to B

FOLD A to A & B to B

- This template prints correctly on an A4 sized sheet of paper
- Makes a booklet style CD/DVD cover side sealing CD Sleeve
- First print this page.
- Then cut along the black line with an exacto knife against a straight edge.
- The dotted red square is the front pane. Its sides are to be folded back.

2 Fold this tab along the dotted red line and glue to back pane

1 Fold this tab along the dotted red line and glue to back pane

**Assembly instructions (after printing and cutting):**

First fold tabs 1 & 2. Then fold the back pane at 3-3. Put glue on the two side tabs 1 & 2 then press down the back pane on top of that gluing it to the two side flaps. This creates a pocket for the CD/DVD. Then fold the back flap at 4-4 over it to keep the CD/DVD from sliding back out.

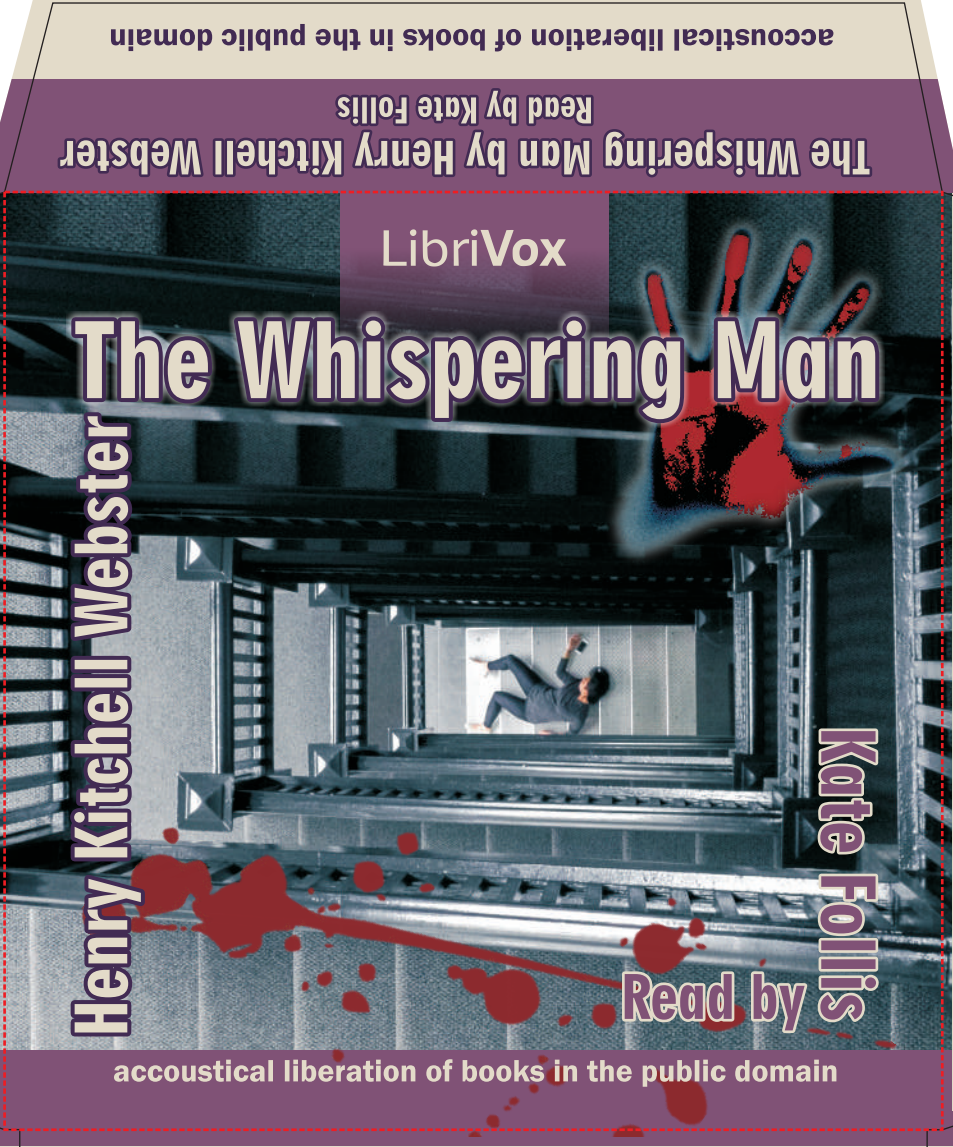

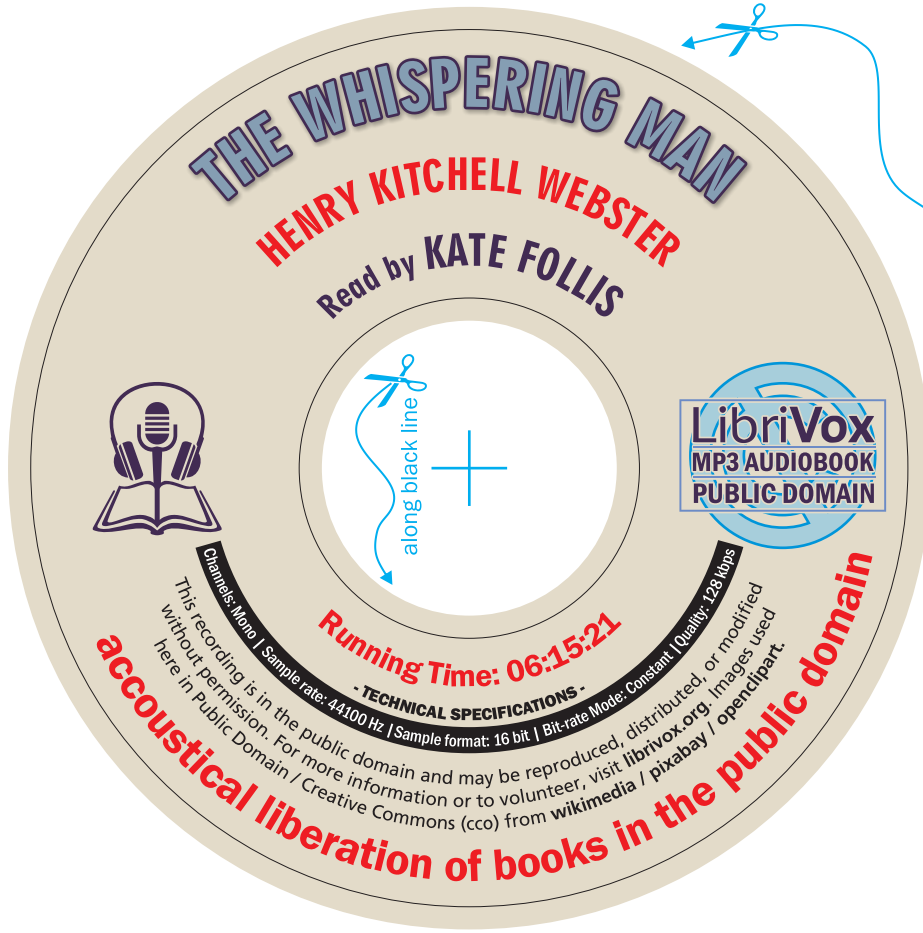

BACK FLAP

- Use either the commercial Avery L7676 CD/DVD Self Adhesive labels or any A4 sized self adhesive sticker sheet and cut along the outer and inner black circle lines and paste on the CD/DVD.
- Cut the page in two across dotted blue line A-A and use the remaining sheet for printing another CD/DVD label next time using the same printer settings.



If using plain sticker sheet, cut along this black line circle and the similar smaller one towards the middle
