Things to Bring

- Bible

- Air fryers are permitted, but open flames and hot plates are prohibited in and around the dormitories.
- Students will be responsible to provide any personal toiletries, though toilet paper and paper towels will be provided by the school.
- Laundry facilities will be provided. Students should plan to supply their own detergents and come ready with a plan to transport laundry items.

Dress Code

- Our dress codes serve as a training tool in raising personal standards of professionalism and discipline and are, in no way, an effort to stifle individual expression. As with much of our program, this code of acceptable attire will grow the student's ability to confidently represent Jesus in whatever avenues lie ahead.
- The Texas Bible Institute team reserves the right to discuss specific scenarios with students as situations arise.

Things That Students Will Assume You Know

"But what will I wear?"

- The general dress code for official student activities, including classes and Ministry of Helps assignments, is as follows:
 - Bottoms: Blue or black jeans with no holes, tears, or patches. Ladies who choose to wear dresses or skirts must be sure that the hem length falls no higher than a fingertip length with the hands at rest.
 - Tops: Acceptable tops for men include collared button-down shirts or polos, along with plain-color or patterned sweaters. For women, collared shirts, blouses and sweaters are acceptable. Keep in mind that midriff should not be bare under any circumstance while outside of the dormitories. T-shirts of any kind, tops with graphics and/or lettering and hoodies are not to be worn to official student events. Students may utilize layers or non-athletic jackets as desired.
 - Shoes: Dress shoes, flats, loafers, dress sandals and laced casual shoes (i.e. Vans) in solid colors are all options available to students during classes and official events. Flip flops or hiking sandals, athletic sneakers (basketball shoes), tennis shoes, slippers and open-backed Crocs (or similar shoes) or shoes with holes are to be worn only on personal free time.

Things That Students Will Assume You Know

- Accessories:
 - Facial piercings are prohibited during official student activities, but can be worn in dormitories and during free time.
 - New tattoos are not permitted during the students' time at TBI, but previous tattoos will not need to be covered.
 - Any type of hat or cap, including beanies, are not to be worn during official activities, but may be allowed during Ministry of Helps assignment if permitted by the department leader.

Weekly Notes

- **BWOC** - Sundays will be spent at Believers World Outreach Church in Brookshire, TX. Transportation to and from services will be the responsibility of each student, though students who do not bring vehicles usually have no issue finding rides with others.
- Your tuition includes all of your meals provided by our campus food services team. **Meals are served daily Tuesday through Saturday.** Sundays include a small breakfast and dinner by sign-up. On Mondays, dinner is available by sign-up. There are no other meals on Monday to allow our food services team to rest and reset.
- **Student Jobs** - While it is our hope that students could be solely focused on the program, their time with Jesus, and growing in relationships during this short period of time, we understand that some may need to continue working. If you feel the need to have a job while here, please request a copy of the full program calendar to give to any prospective employers to ensure that they are fully aware of your prior responsibilities. Most local grocery stores and restaurants are happy to have TBI students, and we would expect you to reflect a Kingdom standard in the way you work.
