I thoroughly enjoyed "lock down" in Feb 2020. The people I loved the most were all home and I got to spend quality time with them without having to rush off to work, school or activities. Kev and I continued to work. He was an essential worker and I worked from home. We got heaps done on the property, all those "round-to-it" jobs—deck built, sorting out the garden, painting—and we got to meet the neighbours at a two-metre distance. We baked cookies each week and dropped them off to everyone's letterboxes with an encouraging letter and offer of help for anyone who needed it. It was a real time of community and connection, of kindness and looking out for our neighbours.

Arthur was in his last year at high school, Martha was into her first year of exams at high school and Jasper was preparing for a mission trip to the Solomon Islands. I relished this time with us all together at home. I knew it would soon pass.

I grew my business from local to national that year and invested in a mentor. I joined AMP Gold with Dr Benjamin Hardy, following his thirty-day challenge in January. He's an outstanding organisational psychologist who spoke into my heart and mind. I love how he takes scientific concepts and makes sense of them with some really practical applications. What a fabulous eye-opener that was.

We show up every week, no one pays us, no one leads us and we journey together. Wow! What a journey of discovery and adventure that has been.
